

## **Fordham University Profile**

Fordham University was established in 1841 as part of a Roman Catholic educational complex that includes a liberal arts and sciences school as well as a theological education program. Fordham University is unique because it offers students the ability to enjoy a park like campus setting within 30 minutes of New York City. I think this issue is important to students who want an exciting cultural experience within one of the city's five boroughs, without actually living in the city. The university is located within the Belmont section of the Bronx, which is one of the city's boroughs. The footprint of the site is normal for a large private school located within an urban area. The school's footprint is approximately 85 acres in size, which extends through the western Bronx community.

Fordham is also unique because it borders several large parks and nature preserves within an overall urban landscape including New York's Botanical Garden, the Bronx Zoo, and Van Courtland Park located off Southern Blvd. These natural landscapes act like natural barriers for the campus. The school is very spread out geographically for a city school with university facilities starting on Fordham Road to the south and continuing up to Southern (Kazimiroff) Blvd along Webster Avenue to the west. The university also has buildings on the eastern edge of the community off Kazimiroff Blvd. As you can see, the university's footprint is large for a private urban school. Fordham's campus facilities offer students a comfortable internal landscape within a mixed commercial and residential community.

The campus has approximately 32 buildings including lecture, residential, research & resource centers, and dining facilities. The internal campus setting also provides students and employees with several types of services including health, physical fitness, library, and cultural meeting places. The issue of student housing on campus is a not challenge for Fordham because the school actively competes for real estate resources within the general area of the university. Fordham has purchased several local commercial properties over the years to convert into new academic, and residential facilities for students.

The physical layout of the academic buildings, athletic fields, and residence halls at Fordham is unique for a college campus because the student housing is arranged on both ends of the campus, with Edward's Parade (Great Lawn) in the middle. The school's student center, and sports & recreation facilities are located in close proximity to the residence halls on the northern edge of the property, while library facilities are located on the southern area. The lecture halls are located in the middle of campus off Eddy Green for easy access to classes. Fordham University is a large sized urban school that feels like a smaller school because the campus landscape is big, but student resources are close together and active.

The internal campus setting at Fordham provides students and employees with several types of student services including physical fitness, library, cultural meeting places, and dining halls. Fordham's observed focal point of reference during the campus tour was the McGinley Student Center, which is the main student life hall. My tour guide told me that students come to the center to relax, and eat in the food court. Students also use the Lombardi physical fitness center to workout, socialize, and talk about school and life. The student, and fitness center facilities are large for a private school with offices for all the student clubs and recreational activities located under one roof for students to enjoy.

Fordham is a large private Catholic school that has public transportation links to everywhere in the city on a 24-hour basis including music & theatre productions, sporting & cultural events, museums, nightlife, and restaurants. The university's western Bronx location also allows students to enjoy a mixed natural/ urban landscape while having the ability to engage in professional activities and learning.

The published demographic information for the university describes a culturally diverse student population with students from all across the world. Fordham University has developed several different campuses, within it's educational network to offer students a Liberal Arts and Science, Research, and a Comprehensive education format to enhance it's commitment to different types of career endeavors. Below is a description of demographics for Fordham's Rose Hill Campus in Belmont section of the Bronx.

**Fordham University:** The University is home to approximately 3,098 male, and 4,034 female full time students, and 195 male, and 325 female part time students. Fordham also has a large graduate school population with 2,635 male, and 4,166 female students enrolled. The average age of a freshman is 19 years old. 60% of students are from New York, with the rest coming from 49 states, 50 foreign countries and Canada. The campus demographic observes a multi-cultural makeup including 60% of students are white, 8% are African American, 7% Asian Americans, and 15% are Hispanic.

#### **Published Academic Standards for Admission Programs**

Fordham has a large educational system for a private Catholic school, which offers Liberal Arts, and Sciences, Performing Arts, and Business programs. Below is a specific list of under graduate admission requirements.

**Fordham University:** Freshman Class: 22,035 applied, 9,281 accepted, 1,784 enrolled. SAT Verbal 620, SAT Math 610. ACT 27 Application Deadline Regular Decision: November 1.

**Faculty/ Classroom:** 64% of faculty is male, 36% female. 74% of professors teach and do research. The average class size in an introductory lecture is 21; laboratory, 11; and in a regular course, 17.

**Student / Faculty Ratio: 16 to 1**

**Retention Rate: 10% do not continue beyond 1<sup>st</sup> year, 80% remain to graduate.**

**Campus Footprint:** The design and physical setting of the university is unique because the campus is located within the Bronx neighborhood of Belmont on the western edge of New York City's five boroughs. The campus map highlights several multi-story Gothic Style brick buildings, which form a city grid around the Rose Hill facility. These buildings conform to the school's unique landscape of religious and modern buildings that make up Fordham's campus map. The school's overall footprint is approximately 10 city blocks long, and 9 blocks wide with multiple pedestrian, and vehicle entrances.

The university is also linked together by several city streets within its massive real estate holdings with virtually all of the university's lecture halls, arts & science pavilions, residence halls, and historic buildings tied within the urban neighborhood. The footprint of the university is unique because students can retreat to their residence halls, or they can travel to other facilities, including Lincoln Center in New York City to experience real big campus living. This type of structure enhances the campus lifestyle within the school's urban footprint because students can walk to several areas of the campus within minutes.

Fordham University has a real big campus feel to it because the area is heavily populated with students, and local residents alike. University students take advantage of the local commercial resources in the area that cater to college students including the local Italian restaurants on Arthur Avenue. Students, and local residents also take advantage of the New York City Transit System's (D Line) train service located on Fordham Road, which is approximately 1 block from the middle of campus. Pedestrian traffic for the university is usually contained to areas around Fordham Road, Webster Avenue, and Southern Blvd in the daytime, but at night students stay closer to Fordham Road for nightlife activities.

The university's observed focal point of reference during the campus tour was the "Edwards Parade" which is the center of the campus. Student pedestrian sidewalks all converge at the campus green from several locations around the campus including the academic, and residence halls. When you look at the campus map you can easily observe the main focal point. My tour guide told us that students come to this grassy area to relax and talk about school and life. This physical layout is shaped like a big oval that offers outstanding views of Keating Hall from several areas of the campus. This geographical location is Main Street for Fordham students and is the focal point for the school's photo advertising.

The overall physical layout of the campus is typical of a college setting with wide sidewalks, grass field meeting places, and park like benches. The pedestrian flow of traffic within the facility was centered on several of the residence halls including O'Hare and Loschert, and several academic buildings including Dealy and Keating Halls during my daytime visit. I also observed students enjoying several student facilities during my visit including the Walsh Library, McGinley, and Lombardi student centers. My evening visit observed almost the same level of foot traffic around the perimeter of the school until evening classes were over.

The Physical design, and cultural landscape of the university also allows students to get away from classes to retreat to their residence halls. This type of structure enhances the campus lifestyle within the schools sprawling footprint. The buildings geographical design features form a large oval in which students can enter, and leave the campus from several locations. Parking resources on campus are a challenge due to the limited number of parking permits issued to students and employees. The university also has a large graduate school population who require parking services on campus, not to mention the daily academic, and sports activities that visitors enjoy while on the campus. Parking on the Rose Hill campus is limited to 1 parking lot (A), and 1 multi-level parking deck for students, employees, and visitors. These parking lots maintain the campus perimeter because they act almost like a second natural barrier for safety and security.

### **Community Profile**

The Belmont area of the Bronx has been identified on maps geographically as south of the N.Y. Botanical Gardens on Southern (Kazimiroff Blvd), and north of Webster Avenue between The Cross Bronx Expressway to the East, and Bedford Park Blvd to the West. The community has been described as the original “Little Italy” because of it’s Italian roots on Arthur Ave, which is Main Street for home style Italian food. The area can also be considered scholarly and intellectual due to its student population and historical neighborhood architecture.

The Belmont section of the Bronx is first, and foremost a mixed commercial and residential community of working class families with a very diverse demographic. The greatest number of residents in the community north of Fordham Road is in fact a Fordham University student. Fordham University can also be considered the main property owner within the area; it owns most of the real estate housing up to Southern Blvd. The local pedestrian walkways on Fordham Road, Webster Ave, and Southern (Kazimiroff) Blvd links local residents to a large number of restaurants and local shops in the area.

The community has a real ethnic/welcoming type feel to it because a large number of people live, work, and study within the area. New York City itself is a maze of local neighborhoods that are unique to the people who live and work in them. The Belmont section can be considered a mixed residential area because you have commercial, residential, cultural, and intellectual all within the same block with people walking around, and through the Fordham campus on their way to work, or home. The area around the school is a major pedestrian walkway for Bronx residents, tourist, and commuters because it’s really in the middle of the community. That’s why you can find endless shopping and restaurants in area including Arthur Avenue (Little Italy) off 187<sup>th</sup> Street.

The issue of walking alone at night outside the perimeter of the campus gates should be curtailed because you're in a big city with big city crime. The major avenues become less populated after 7:00PM due to the large commercial establishments in the area. The community has several parks, ball fields, and tourist areas including the N.Y. Botanical Garden, and Van Courtland Park off Southern Blvd that attracts a relatively large pedestrian population, but these locations close after dark. Local Police Officers from the 48<sup>th</sup> Precinct (NYPD) have told students to exercise some caution when using the city parks after dark because exterior lighting maybe an issue for personal security. The same can be true for walking alone in areas your not familiar with.

**Community demographics:** The following demographics for New York City describe a multi-cultural community within a total population of 8,214,426 according to the U.S. Census Bureau. A Census Bureau community survey highlights several characteristics to describe the population including: 47.7% of residents are male, 52.3 are female. 43.9% of residents are white, 25.1% are African American, 27.6% are Hispanic or Latino, 11.7% are Asian, 6.3% are some other Race, and finally 2.0 are two or more Races. The median age of population is 35.9 years old. 76.3% of residents are 18 years old or over and 12.1% of city residents is over the age of 65. The issue of housing in New York is also interesting. 91.2% of all housing units within the city are occupied. 65.6% of housing units are renter-occupied, while 34.4% of units are owner-occupied.

**Local weather:** Weather is also an issue to consider for students preparing for a university experience. New York City enjoys all four seasons of weather including rain and snow. Northeast weather patterns sometimes allow for temperatures to drop below 32 degrees for a considerable amount of time during the winter. New York City also gets it's share of rain during the spring and summer months as well.

## **Campus Life**

Fordham University is a multi-cultural campus environment that provides students with an excellent social, and educational atmosphere. The admissions demographics paint a picture of a very diverse community with students from all over the world. The local community of Belmont only adds to the universities international status because the community has multi-cultural roots as well. Fordham University also addresses the issue of ecology in a positive way. The physical environment is clean and well maintained and the economic conditions are favorable to students and local residents due to the available services in walking distance to the school.

The emotional climate and culture of the entire Fordham community is social due to it's close relationship with community, it's mature student population, and educational resources in my opinion. Fordham is an attractive institution because it offers students a religious education with real world professional experiences in New York City. The university also provides it's students with lasting relationships with local organizations and community groups through student activities throughout the year. This issue of school culture is also a very important part of campus life because everyone wants to have a connection and emotional fit to their new school and community.

Fordham has done a great job developing positive social systems with its students by providing a series of coordinated programs including workshops and seminars for freshman students. This type of process provides a foundation for learning and personal growth providing over 133 academic clubs, student organizations, and over 22 intramural sports activities. Fordham also participates in 36 NCAA Division I Varsity Sports for Women and Men where becoming a Ram fan are a big deal on campus, especially during basketball season.

Campus life at Fordham is more than academic excellence; it's about building personal relationships with students and faculty that continues throughout each student's career. The school also offers students the ability to enjoy school sports, fraternities, performing arts, history, cultural events, restaurants, and local museums. For example, the City of New York has hundreds of venues to enjoy the previously stated activities including the Metropolitan Art Museum, Lincoln Center, Madison Square Garden, Yankee Stadium, and Carnegie Hall to mention a few. The university also has several global education centers within its campus network for students to learn, and gather information about international careers.

**Student Housing:** The purpose of student housing is to provide safe and reasonable accommodations for students living away from home. The issue of housing and dormitory life is a critical element of overall campus life because students spend a large amount of time in their rooms. Student housing units historically come in 3 different styles including traditional corridor, suite, and apartment style units.

Fordham University guarantees housing for all undergraduate students (except transfers) who has filed their intent to reside on campus by the stated deadline and who have continuously registered as full time students. Fordham currently has 10 resident halls to accommodate 3,947 students on the Rose Hill campus. The school has also started developing housing resources for upper classman through its capital improvement initiatives. Fordham is building 4 new apartment-style housing facilities on campus (Salice Hall) for upper classman. These new units are scheduled to open in the fall of 2010. The university has also purchased 16 apartment buildings over the years for student housing according to public safety officials. These units are located in walking distance to the campus. Information about housing can be found on the quick links page of this document.

**Off Campus Housing:** Fordham University has been described as a mini-city in a multi-cultural residential community. The reason I have mentioned the overall community of the Bronx is to re-assert the point that Fordham's network of affiliated campuses has encapsulated its real estate holdings within the area. The campus footprint allows almost every student to have housing within walking distance to the campus. The issue of off campus housing has a different feel to it compared to other university off campus housing demands. The demand for housing, especially off campus housing is usually a tough issue for institutions attempting to keep students within the general geographical area.

Fordham has addressed this issue by buying up residential buildings and developing housing networks. Information about off campus housing can be found on the Fordham's quick links page of this document.

**Public Transportation:** The New York City Transit System has a subway that stops 1 block from the campus on the southern edge of the university at Fordham Road. Students and visitors get off the train and walk north to the main entry to the school. The (Orange B & D Lines) stops at Fordham Road but it also connects with every other subway line within the system. Riders can take these trains from Fordham University in the Bronx to Columbus Circle (59<sup>th</sup> Street) in Manhattan to connect with the (Red 1,2, &3 Lines) that takes riders to Penn Station in Midtown in a relatively short amount of time. Students & campus visitors can also take the Metro North Train that stops at the Botanical Garden Station off Southern Blvd for travel to the north of the city.

Regional Public transportation resources can be found within New York Penn Station that links with trains to Long Island and New Jersey through the LIRR and Jersey Transit respectfully. Amtrak also uses Penn Station as a major hub within it's Northeast Corridor. All these trains can be linked by the #1 train, which makes stops at Penn Station. Riders who wish to go to northern New York State can catch a shuttle train at 42<sup>nd</sup> Street from the # 1 train to Grand Central Station for the Metro North Trains.

This complex train system also allows riders the ability to travel to Liberty Airport via Jersey Transit, and Kennedy Airport via the N.Y. Subway system. People who live, work, and visit New York usually travel by some type of mass transit. Students should be encouraged to purchase a metro card to get around. Mass transit information can be found at: <http://www.mta.info> Fordham students can also use several campus shuttles for local transportation to subway stops in the area, including the public safety van (free) as well as the "Ram Van" that takes students into NYC for \$3.00 per trip.

**Description of Campus Public Safety Plans & Procedures:** Fordham's public safety plans and procedures can be found in the emergency plan which gives students and employees a lists of instructions, procedures, codes of conduct, and response strategies to follow while on campus. The university also provides Clery Act safety tips and procedures to help educate students to potential risks on, and off campus. This information can be found in Fordham's Annual Public Safety Report. The Emergency Plan can be found on the quick links page of this document.

**Crisis Management Plans & Procedures Local Community:** The City of New York has developed emergency management resources to help residents to prepare, respond, and recover from a host of natural, and man made events. The city agency responsible for emergency operations is the Office of Emergency Management. Fordham has developed an emergency plan for students and employees to follow which highlights several potential manmade and weather related events. Public safety, along with the local Police Precinct (48<sup>th</sup> Pct) has developed a local crisis plan that can be found at: <http://nyc/html/oem/html/home/home.shtml>.

**Innovative Emergency Communications:** Fordham University's security network has developed reverse 911 systems that sends several types of emergency notifications through e-mail and phone text message systems. Campus alerts, and weather related information is sent through this system. The university also has active shooter protocols for students to follow during an emergency including lock-down, and lockout procedures. These messages are usually received within 1-2 minutes of emergency broadcast and allow university officials to adhere to Clery Act requirements for timely warnings of emergency events.

**Campus Access Control & Security Systems:**

The design, and physical setting of a particular institution has elements relating to the overall culture and social system on campus. Since college and university campuses are designed to offer (open) movement of people through it's borders, the issue of design, along with effective use of space can reduce both the incidence, and fear of crime. This design feature is called "Crime Prevention through Environmental Control." The proper design and effective use of the built environment can lead to a reduction in the fear and incidence of crime and an improvement in the quality of life. The issues of identifying formal gathering and high- risk areas within a campus footprint are also critical to public safety resources because manpower must be observed in these areas.

The issue of high-risk areas on campus has been identified during annual risk assessments by security, and feedback by all intuitional stakeholders including public safety officials. The Fordham University Public Safety Department maintains fixed posts within several of it's student service, and residence buildings. Uniform officers also patrol around the campus on foot, and in several different types of patrol vehicles including 4-wheel drive, bicycle, and regular police patrol vehicles. These resources help officer's patrol around the campus 24-hours a day to reduce the number of people who may not have legitimate business within Fordham property.

Public safety also maintains visitor screening and CCTV resources to highlight the need for formal surveillance throughout the campus footprint. Fordham has developed clearly worded signage that directs visitors to a welcome area within the admissions office across from Eddy Green to improve physical security operations. Formal gathering areas within campus are situated in, and around McGinley Campus Center, Walsh Library, Eddy Green, the Lombardi Center, and finally the residence hall buildings, which are located on both ends of the campus. The school has several pedestrian walkways that take you around to the above-mentioned areas. These are the main focal area of the campus because the walkway splits the campus in half with several large grassy areas between the lecture, and residence halls. The sidewalk acts like a quad because you can access several areas of the campus in a textbook example of CPTED.

The campus high-risk areas including the residence halls should have a higher degree of natural and formal surveillance for students and visitors. Fordham uses several types of formal surveillance resources including CCTV, and Analog cameras with DVR & Virtual Network recording systems to enhance overall security within the residence halls. The university also has student security officers patrolling the campus to improve natural surveillance on the Rose Hill campus. Fordham University provides students living on campus with several types of security requirements to enhance surveillance including, students who enter the residence halls before 6:00 PM produce their building key to enter the facility, after 6:00 PM students must produce their Fordham card and show it to a student security officer situated behind a desk in the residence hall. A contract security guard who identifies student I.D.'s within the facility greets students who enter the residence halls after 10:00PM.

Fordham doesn't use student swipe cards for access control at this time, the university is going through a growth period in which they are building new residence halls that will have state of the art access control technology. The older residence halls will have upgraded swipe card technology installed after the new halls are finished.

The campus has a main gate that provides access control for a large number of daily students, visitors, and employees. The university also has an additional 6 entrances and exits for pedestrian, and service vehicles to maximize the flow of traffic within the facility. The issue of pedestrian traffic on the perimeter of the campus is a challenge for public safety due to the high number of local residents using the main sidewalks around the perimeter of the campus. Fordham University uses metal fencing as a main access control feature; students who wish to use the pedestrian walkways to access the campus must produce their student I.D. cards to public safety officials to open the gates.

### **Types and Descriptions of Published Policies and Procedures to Comply with the Clery Act on Campus**

The Clery Act. The Crime Awareness and Campus Security Act of 1990 requires all postsecondary institutions participating in the Title IV student financial aid programs to disclose campus crime statistics, university violations and disciplinary data, and finally security information to the U.S. Department of Education on an annual basis. The legislation also describes several required policy statements that address public safety and security issues. Below is a sample list of Clery Act Policy Statements for colleges and universities to publish each year within their prospective crime report/audits.

Required policy statements include: addressing timely warnings, disclosure of crime statistics, reporting criminal offenses, confidential reporting, security and access control, arrest authority, security awareness programs, crime prevention programs, sex offenses, alcoholic beverages, illegal drugs, substance abuse programs, and general codes of conduct. Fordham's Clery Act info can be found on the quick link page.

**Caveat:** Fordham's public safety officers don't have formal arrest powers; but the school has retained several retired NYPD Police Officers for their public safety department. The university does call the NYPD (48<sup>th</sup> Precinct) to investigate criminal activity on campus, and the school does provide public safety resource through it's experienced staff to reduce victimization off campus. Public Safety seems to have improved crime victimization on campus due to improved security resources but the following statement from the department education offers this advice. " The department data reported by the institutions have not been subjected to independent verification by the U.S. Department of Education. Therefore, the department cannot vouch for the accuracy of the data reported. Fordham University Clery crime data can be found at:

**Local Crime Statistics:** The Federal Bureau of Investigation's Uniform Crime Report for 2008 has developed crime statistics for the Belmont section of the Bronx New York. In 2008 the NYPD's 48 Precinct reported 777 Violent Crimes, 7 Murders, 25 Forcible Rapes, 383 Robberies, 362 Aggravated Assaults, 740 Property Crimes, 285 Burglaries, 325 Larceny Thefts, and finally 130 Motor Vehicle Thefts. The crime of Arson was un-reported.
