

## **Lafayette College Profile**

Founded in 1826, Lafayette College is a small private institution offering Liberal Arts & Sciences, Business, and Engineering educational programs. The school itself is located in the historic factory town of Easton Pennsylvania. Lafayette College itself is actually situated geographically within the city's College Hill community, which overlooks the city. The landscape of the site is split into 2 large facilities, one being the main campus on the top of College Hill, and the second being the Metzgar Athletic Complex that contains several sports facilities within its 230 acre site. The complex is located 3 miles north of the main campus on top of College Hill.

The university has a large footprint of approximately 342 acres of park like property within the hilltop community of Easton. The physical layout observes numerous historic buildings shared by students, and local residents. The campus itself has approximately 72 buildings including lecture, residential, research, performing arts, athletic, and dining facilities. The overall campus map is typical of a college setting with wide sidewalks; grass field meeting places, and park like benches but the campus building, and landscape architecture is far from typical. The school has renovated several of its buildings over the past few years to offer students an intellectual environment housed within historical building structures, that accents colonial architecture.

The pedestrian flow of traffic within the facility was centered mainly between Markle Hall, and the grassy area around Farinon Center along Quad Drive. This main sidewalk/street connects several academic, research, and student life centers within the campus. I observed heavy pedestrian traffic in the area during my visit due to the time of day and my student tour guides told me that walkway gets packed with students going to different places in the morning when school is in session. The campus buildings and open spaces were also very clean and well maintained during my tour observations. These open spaces, and campus facilities allow students the ability to interact with each other in a non-educational manner due to the high number of observed meeting places on campus.

Lafayette students, faculty, and employees enjoy a community, within a community lifestyle in regard to on, and off campus activities and resources. The college also provides several critical student resources including student housing on campus for all 4 years, which helps students connect with each other throughout the year. The university also provides several types of student housing arrangements on campus including dormitory, apartment, and Greek residences. Approximately 98% of students live on campus according to campus officials. The college has a beautiful internal campus setting that has maintained its local roots and architectural appeal.

The published demographic information for the college describes a culturally diverse student population with students from all across the world. Lafayette has developed a large campus community to offer students an excellent Engineering, Liberal Arts and Sciences, and Business educational formats to enhance its commitment to different types of career endeavors.

**Lafayette College:** The college is home to a small campus population of approximately 1,198 male, and 1,083 female full, and 32 male, and 33 female part time students enrolled. Lafayette doesn't offer graduate school programs. The average age of a freshman is 18 years old. 28% of students are from Pennsylvania. Others are from 30 states, and 40 foreign countries. Students on campus provide a diverse multi-cultural makeup including 82.9% of students are white, 2.4% Asian, 4.8% are Black, and 4.2% are Hispanic.

**Published Academic Standards for Admission Programs**

Lafayette College has a large educational system for a small private school, which offers Engineering, Liberal Arts and Sciences, and Business programs. Below is a specific list of under graduate admission requirements.

**Lafayette College:** Freshman Class: 6,357 applied, 2,366 accepted, 601 enrolled. SAT Verbal 630, SAT Math 670. ACT 28. Application Deadline January 1.

**Faculty/ Classroom:** 74% of faculty is male, 26% female. All both teach and do research. The average class size in a laboratory is 12, in a regular course, 17.

**Student / Faculty Ratio: 11 to 1**

**Retention Rate: 5% do not continue beyond 1<sup>st</sup> year, 92% remain to graduate.**

**Campus Footprint:** An observation of the internal campus setting provides students and employees with several types of student services including physical fitness, residence, athletic, library services, and cultural meeting places and dining halls. I observed heavy pedestrian traffic from these areas of the campus due to the location of the dining hall, and the time of day. The internal landscape of the school is oval shaped with students reading, eating, and talking to each other in the middle of the Quad. This an interesting point to make in regard to the school's location within a mountain of a Pennsylvanian town. When you walk onto the Lafayette campus you forget where you are for the moment, the campus landscape is big, beautiful, and historic. The old factory buildings can be observed adjacent to the Delaware River, but the campus feels like a world apart.

Lafayette's campus is built on top of a mountain, which makes the school unique because you can stay within College Hill, or you can retreat to the town to enjoy off campus social activities by walking down the mountain. The school does have a beautiful pedestrian walkway (Quad Drive) in the middle of the campus, which starts at Markle Hall and winds several blocks until you arrive at Farinon Student Center. The walkway has an internal feel to it because all the campus buildings face the sidewalk and you really can't see the town below from this vantage point. The school is also unique because it has a large suburban school feel to it, while still being situated in a relatively large Pennsylvanian town. The campus has several buildings with colonial architecture that is beautiful to look at. These historic buildings make the campus look very big, but it feels smaller than the observed geographical footprint.

The university's observed focal point of reference during the campus tour was the area in, and around the Quad, which is the center of the campus. Student pedestrian sidewalks all converge at this point from several locations around the campus including the academic, and residence halls. When you look at the campus map you can easily observe the main focal point. My tour guide told us that students come to the grassy areas around the library, student, and recreational center to relax and talk about school and life.

The design and physical setting of the university is unique because the campus is located within its own hilltop community with several small clusters of old factories, and private homes close to the river below. The overall security geography is also unique because the university uses the mountain's physical landscaping, along with a few brick archways around the school's perimeter to give it a welcoming, and private community feel to it. These physical barriers provide access control to several vehicle, and pedestrian entrances on top of the mountain, which requires I.D. for access control in the day, and night as well.

The internal map of the school observes several unique features within the site due to its multiple campus design. The school is split into 2 parts, including a large sports facility situated off Sullivan Trail. The other traditional college facilities are located within the main campus between College Avenue and Bushkill Drive. The school also has numerous Greek houses along Sullivan Road to the south, and McCartney Street to the north end of campus.

The physical landscape of the college allows students to get away from classes to retreat to their residence halls, which are located on both ends of the school. These types of structures enhance the campus lifestyle within the schools sprawling footprint. The buildings geographical design features form a large oval in which students can enter, and leave the campus from several locations. Parking resources is also a big feature on campus due to the limited number of parking permits issued to students and employees. Parking is a big challenge for public safety at Lafayette because the college is located in a hilltop community with a limited number of parking lots for students, employees, and visitors. The college has 2 observed parking decks, one for visitors and administrative staff, and the other for students with parking privileges. Students at the college have access to several transportation resources on campus, which helps limit the need for student parking permits.

The college is also linked together by several city streets within its massive real estate holdings with virtually all of the university's lecture halls, arts & science pavilions, residence halls, and historic buildings tied within its large real estate holdings. The footprint is unique because students can retreat to their residence halls, or they can travel to local eateries and shops just off campus to experience community living. These types of educational, and social resources enhance the campus lifestyle within each schools urban & suburban footprint because students can travel to several areas in a short period of time.

**Local weather:** Weather is also an issue to consider for students preparing for a college experience. The Lehigh Valley enjoys all four seasons of weather including rain and snow. Northeast weather patterns sometimes allow for temperatures to drop below 32 degrees for a considerable amount of time during the winter. Pennsylvania also gets its share of snow during this period. Students experience periods of rain during the spring and summer months as well. A strong indicator of pedestrian traffic around the college can be identified by the northeast weather patterns. Student parking within close proximity to campus buildings and student shuttle services help reduce the exposure literally and figuratively.

## Community Profile

The City of Easton has been described as a historic city due to its relationship to the American Revolution as a meeting place for several Declaration of Independence signers. The community also has its roots in the manufacturing industry due to the city's geographical location on the Delaware River, and proximity to the steel industry of Lehigh Valley. Students and residents enjoy the community's economical, and cultural landscape within the city because its close to the campus. The city has also been described, as a student friendly community because of the school's historical population was factory workers themselves. Lafayette also has an intellectual side due to its historical neighborhood architecture and close physical relationship to the above-mentioned work force. The local area is favorable to students and residents because it offers several pedestrian walkways to Centre Square, which links students, visitors, and local residents to a several restaurants and local shops within walking distance to the campus.

The City of Easton is located within the northeastern area of the state, which makes it convenient to several suburban, and city communities including Philipsburg across the bridge in New Jersey, and the cities of Allentown and Reading within the Lehigh Valley Region. These communities have several major highway networks that offer residents efficient transportation resources to all areas of the state including Route 78, 476, and 22. The Lehigh Valley also links to Amtrak, which is the main connection to the northeast corridor for rail service. Easton also has several local roadways that connect the community to major state highways including Routes 222, and 33 that links to the Pocono Mountain Resort area, and Interstate 76. Shopping, restaurants, and hotel chains can be found within these major transportation networks after a short drive from the campus. Appendix #1 on the back page of this profile lists several of observed resources in close proximity to the school.

The following demographics for the City of Easton describe a multi-cultural community within a total population of 26,209 according to the U.S. Census Bureau. Lafayette College has strong relationships with the city because they share community services including public safety, and cultural resources. An example of this commitment can be observed through the college's community services handbook.

A Census Bureau community survey highlights several characteristics to describe the population including: 49.3% of residents are male, 50.7% are female. 78.5% of residents are white, 12.7% are African American, 9.8% is Hispanic or Latino, and 1.7% are Asian. 23.3% of residents are 18 years old or over, and 12% of city residents is over the age of 65. The issue of housing in Easton is also interesting. 48.5% of housing units are renter-occupied, while 41.5% of units are owner-occupied.

## **Campus Life**

Lafayette College is a multi-cultural campus environment that provides students with an excellent social, and educational atmosphere. The admissions demographics paint a picture of a very diverse community with students from all over the world. The local suburban community of Campus Hill only adds to the college's international status because the community has multi-cultural roots as well. Lafayette addresses the issue of ecology in a positive way with the campus being situated within a historical area with new buildings being constructed to match the colonial style architecture. An example of this type of new construction can be observed within Ramer History House. The school has also developed green technologies and architecture for the campus including the new Hugel Science Center, and the Skillman Library

The campus was clean and well maintained and the emotional climate of the entire community is positive because students are involved with local community, and campus groups through the student center and Greek life. An observation of this very positive emotional climate can be found by looking at the endless student flyers posted throughout the campus on walls, doors, windows, and light poles. These flyers describe upcoming activities and they invite all students to enjoy the clubs, performing arts, and public discussions on world events. Social networking beyond the campus walls is also a very important issue to be observed at Lafayette. Students at the college are encouraged to participate in externships with alumni to gain real world experience in each student's major. These programs, along with internships, and global learning centers offer valuable information for students studying abroad, which helps round out their individual educational activities on campus.

This issue of school culture and emotional attachment is also a very important part of campus life because everyone wants to have a connection and emotional fit to their new school and community. The college has done a great job developing positive social systems with it's students by providing a series of coordinated programs including workshops and seminars for freshman students. This type of process provides a foundation for learning and personal growth providing over 250 academic, and 44 athletic clubs, and student organizations. Lafayette also has 23 NCAA Division I teams for men and women to participate in.

Campus life at Lafayette can be considered intellectual, and social due to several notable student venues including Farinon Student Center, which is the main social center on campus. The second location for social activities is down the hill from campus called “The Spot”. These on, and off campus facilities allows students to enjoy more than academic excellence, it gives them the opportunity to develop social relationships by experiencing school sports, Greek life, performing arts, history, cultural events, restaurants, and local museums together.

**Student Housing:** The purpose of student housing is to provide safe and reasonable accommodations for students living away from home. The issue of housing and dormitory life is a critical element of overall campus life because students spend a large amount of time in their rooms. Student housing units historically come in 3 different styles including traditional corridor, suite, and apartment style units.

Lafayette College guarantees on campus housing for all of it’s students. The school provides housing for 98% of it’s total student population including the Greek Houses. The college has a large Greek presence on campus with 26% of male, and 45 % of female students living in fraternities, and sororities. These Greek houses can be observed while driving on Sullivan Road, and McCartney Street on the campus perimeter. Information about housing can be found on the quick links page of this document.

**Off Campus Housing:** Lafayette College has been described as a small private college within a hilltop residential community. The reason I have mentioned the overall community is to re-assert the point that school’s network of facilities has encapsulated the real estate holdings in the area. The campus design allows a large number of students to have housing within walking distance to campus facilities. The issue of off campus housing has a different feel to it compared to other university housing demands. The college itself has 98% of it’s student population living on campus which reduces the need, or demand for off campus housing. Students who want off campus housing can find information about available resources on the quick links page.

**Public Transportation:** Campus transportation resources for students are available through the college’s shuttle system, which provides van service for daily classes, student activities, and links to local shopping and restaurants. This service is crucial to students who don’t have cars because it provides transportation services to the entire community. The school’s shuttle service provides reliable transportation to students who don’t, or can’t have vehicles on campus. The college also has a very large number of out of state students who don’t know the streets and highways very well. Knowing the area is key because students who come from local states may know the area better and may be able to walk or drive to local destinations. Foreign, and out of state students might opt to take a bus or train to their destination because they don’t want to risk getting lost on local roads.

**Description of Campus Public Safety Plans & Procedures:** Campus communities are unique places due to their populations and physical layouts. In some areas of the United States you really can't tell where a campus begins or ends because people walk through, drive through, and take campus transportation through all areas of the campus footprint. Lafayette has developed public safety plans and procedures to keep students, and employees safe. The school's general public safety plans and procedures can be found in the document "Emergency Preparedness Plan" which gives students and employees a list of instructions, procedures, codes of conduct, and response strategies to follow while on campus. This information can be found in Lafayette's Annual Public Safety Report.

**Crisis Management Plans & Procedures Local Community:** Historically, FEMA has identified risk factors within specific geographical areas of the United States. The western states have fires and earthquakes, the mid-west has tornados, the gulf, and eastern seaboard states have hurricanes. And finally, the northeast has a combination of snow and wind related weather events. Each area of the United States requires crisis management plans to help people recover from disaster events. Colleges and universities usually develop plans and procedures that complement local community resources, in some cases schools are required by state and federal law to develop plans and procedures.

The State of Pennsylvania has developed emergency management resources to help residents to prepare, respond, and recover from a host of natural, and man made events. **Innovative Emergency Communications:** Lafayette College has developed reverse 911 systems that sends several types of emergency notifications through e-mail, hard line, and phone text message systems. Campus alerts, and weather related information is sent through this system. The university also has active shooter protocols for students to follow during an emergency including lock-down, and lockout procedures. These messages are usually received within 1-2 minutes of emergency broadcast and allow university officials to adhere to Clery Act requirements for timely warnings of emergency events.

**Campus Access Control & Security Systems:** The design, and physical setting of a particular institution has elements relating to the overall culture and social system on campus. Since college and university campuses are designed to offer (open) movement of people through it's borders, the issue of design, along with effective use of space can reduce both the incidence, and fear of crime. This design feature is called "Crime Prevention through Environmental Control." The proper design and effective use of the built environment can lead to a reduction in the fear and incidence of crime and an improvement in the quality of life. The issues of identifying formal gathering and high-risk areas within a campus landscape are also critical to public safety because manpower must be observed in these areas.

The design and physical setting of Lafayette College is unique for a small city environment because the campus has historical value due to its geographical location in Pennsylvania. The campus map highlights several historic buildings situated atop a hill, which form a large barrier around the main campus. These buildings, along with natural landscaping form a large oval that's several city block long, and wide. These physical security design features seem to have enhanced the landscape by using natural, and manmade resources to limit access to the overall campus.

The college has several entrances and exits to maximize the pedestrian traffic flow within the facility, the issue of vehicle traffic on campus is minimal due to the city setting and a limited number of street parking spots. Lafayette's public safety department deploys officers to several access points around the campus during the day to reduce the number of people who may not have legitimate business on campus. Public safety also maintains visitor screening with clearly worded signage that directs visitors to a welcome area within Markle Hall (Admissions), visitors who wish to walk around the campus without an escort can, but only during daylight hours.

Formal gathering areas within the campus are situated in, and around the Quad, which is the main pedestrian walkway that connects the campus to several other gathering places including the library, student, and recreational centers. These areas around the Quad also have several residence, and academic halls that connect the pedestrian path to the northeastern edge of the campus. These areas are the main observed focal points of the campus. The design of the campus walk is a textbook example of CPTED because it allows for natural surveillance and open space for people to enjoy while still providing some type of student ownership.

The issue of high-risk areas on campus has been identified during annual risk assessments by security consultants, and feedback by all intuitional stakeholders including public safety officials. The department maintains uniform patrol, fixed security posts, and high tech remote resources to highlight formal surveillance throughout the campus. The department also has public safety officers patrolling on foot in several high-risk areas including the student center, sports venues, and the library. Lafayette public safety officers also patrol the exterior of the college in several types of vehicles including 4-wheel drive trucks.

Lafayette College's public safety officers have attended a formal Police Academy training program to gain formal arrest powers. These officers have the training and ability to investigate criminal activity on, and off campus. The school's public safety department also developed enhanced lighting, and formal surveillance resources (CCTV) for perimeter areas because it helps with surveillance and gives students and visitors an enhanced feeling of safety and security. Lafayette has provided a safe environment on campus but students should be aware that the campus ends when they walk, or drive down the hill. Students should exercise personal awareness while walking on, and beyond the square in downtown Easton after dark because it gets less populated after the local shopping areas close for the night.

The campus high-risk areas including the residence halls require a higher degree of natural and formal surveillance for students and visitors. The university uses Smart Card Readers for access to on campus residence facilities. Students attempting to enter a residence must swipe their student card for entry into the building. Students attempting to enter a different residence hall with their card will be denied access because the card knows where you live. Finally, students living in the Greek residential system have regular keys to their particular houses, not swipe cards.

**Descriptions of Published Policies and Procedures to Comply with the Clery Act**

The Clery Act. The Crime Awareness and Campus Security Act of 1990 requires all postsecondary institutions participating in the Title IV student financial aid programs to disclose campus crime statistics, university violations and disciplinary data, and finally security information to the U.S. Department of Education on an annual basis. The legislation also describes several required policy statements that address public safety and security issues. Below is a sample list of Clery Act Policy Statements for colleges and universities to publish each year within their prospective crime report/audits.

**Required policy statements include:** addressing timely warnings, disclosure of crime statistics, reporting criminal offenses, confidential reporting, security and access control, arrest authority, security awareness programs, crime prevention programs, sex offenses, alcoholic beverages, illegal drugs, substance abuse programs, and general codes of conduct. Lafayette’s Clery Act info can be found on the quick links page.

**Caveat:** Lafayette College’s public safety officers have formal arrest powers; they have the ability to investigate criminal activity on campus, and the resources to reduce victimization off campus. Public Safety seems to have improved crime victimization on campus due to improved security resources but the following statement from the department education offers this advice. “ The department data reported by the institutions have not been subjected to independent verification by the U.S. Department of Education. Therefore, the department cannot vouch for the accuracy of the data reported. Lafayette crime data can be found at: <http://ope.ed.gov/security/Index.aspx>

**Local Crime Statistics:** The Federal Bureau of Investigation’s Uniform Crime Report for 2008 has developed crime statistics for the City of Easton Pennsylvania. In 2008 the Police Department reported 157 Violent Crimes, 2 Murders, 13 Forcible Rapes, 78 Robberies, 64 Aggravated Assaults, 1,023 Property Crimes, 157 Burglaries, 800 Larceny Thefts, and finally 66 Motor Vehicle Thefts. The crime of Arson was reported 11 times in 2008.

**Emergency Medical Technicians:** Lafayette College public safety officers respond to medical emergencies along with city EMS crews. The City of Easton provides EMS and hospital transport services to students, residents, and visitors through emergency notification systems.
