

## **Lehigh University Profile**

Founded in 1865, Lehigh University is a mid-sized private institution offering Engineering, Liberal Arts & Sciences, and Business educational programs. The school itself is located in the historic steel city of Bethlehem Pennsylvania on the Lehigh River. Lehigh University itself is actually situated geographically within the city's south mountain community, which overlooks the city. The footprint of the site is split into 3 large facilities, one being the Asa Packer (main campus) on the bottom of the hill, the second being the Mountaintop campus that contains laboratories, and research facilities, and finally, the Goodman campus which is home to the school's athletic facilities on top of the hill as well.

The university has a large footprint of approximately 1,600 acres of park like property within the south mountain community of Bethlehem. The physical layout observes numerous historic buildings shared by students, and local residents. The campus itself has approximately 155 buildings including lecture, residential, research, performing arts, athletic, and dining facilities that were originally designed by the school's founder, Asa Packer of motorcar fame. The overall campus map is typical of a college setting with wide sidewalks; grass field meeting places, and park like benches but the campus building, and landscape architecture is far from typical.

The pedestrian flow of traffic within the facility was centered mainly between the Alumni Hall, and the grassy area around Taylor Gym along Memorial Walk. This main sidewalk connects several academic, research, and student life centers within the campus. I observed heavy pedestrian traffic during my visit due to the time of day and my student tour guides told me that walkway gets packed with students going to different places in the morning when school is in session. The campus buildings and open spaces were also very clean and well maintained during my tour observations. These open spaces, and campus facilities allow students the ability to interact with each other in a non-educational manner due to the high number of observed meeting places on campus.

Lehigh students, faculty, and employees enjoy a community, within a community lifestyle in regard to on campus activities and resources. The university also provides several types of student housing arrangements on campus including dormitory, apartment, and Greek residences. The university guarantees housing for freshman students only, upperclassmen can receive housing through a lottery system, which allows approximately 69% of students to live on campus. Lehigh University has a beautiful internal campus setting that has maintained it's local roots despite it's growth, and national appeal.

The published demographic information for the college describes a culturally diverse student population with students from all across the world. Lehigh University has developed a large campus community to offer students an excellent Engineering, Liberal Arts and Sciences, and Business educational formats to enhance it's commitment to different types of career endeavors.

**Lehigh University:** The university is home to a mid-sized campus population of approximately 2724 male, and 1,897 female full, and 40 male, and 18 female part time students. Lehigh also has a graduate school population of 1,114 male, 955 female students enrolled. The average age of a freshman is 18 years old. 28% of students are from Pennsylvania. Others are from 49 states, and 45 foreign countries. Students on campus provide a diverse multi-cultural makeup including 80.3% of students are white, 5.4% Asian, 2.4% are Black, 2.4% are Hispanic, and 6.5% are the race is unknown.

### **Published Academic Standards for Admission Programs**

Lehigh University has a large educational system for a mid-sized private school, which offers Engineering, Liberal Arts and Sciences, and Business programs. Below is a specific list of under graduate admission requirements.

**Lehigh University:** Freshman Class: 12,155 applied, 3,882 accepted, 1,166 enrolled. SAT Verbal 640, SAT Math 680. ACT (Unk). Application Deadline January 1.

**Faculty/ Classroom:** 69% of faculty is male, 31% female. All both teach and do research. The average class size in an introductory lecture is 150, in a regular course, 29.

**Student / Faculty Ratio: 11 to 1**

**Retention Rate: 7% do not continue beyond 1<sup>st</sup> year, 85% remain to graduate.**

**Campus Footprint:** An observation of the internal campus setting provides students and employees with several types of student services including physical fitness, residence, athletic, library services, and cultural meeting places and dining halls. I observed heavy pedestrian traffic from these areas of the campus due to the location of the dining hall, and the time of day. The internal landscape of the school is oval shaped with students reading, eating, and talking to each other in the middle of Memorial Walk. This an interesting point to make in regard to the school's location within a mountain of a Pennsylvanian city. When you walk onto the Lehigh University campus you forget where you are for the moment, the campus landscape is big, beautiful, and historic. The old steel mills can be observed across the Lehigh River, but the campus feels like a world apart.

Lehigh's campus is built in, and on top of a mountain, which makes the school unique because you must walk up the mountain to retreat to residence living, and you must walk down the mountain to find academic buildings. The school does have a beautiful pedestrian walkway (Memorial Walk) in the middle of the campus, which starts at the Alumni building and winds several blocks until you arrive at Taylor Gym. The walkway has an internal feel to it because all the campus buildings face the sidewalk and you really can't see the city below from this vantage point. The school is also unique because it has a large suburban school feel to it, while still being situated in a small Pennsylvanian city. The campus has several buildings with Gothic architecture that is beautiful to look at. These historic buildings make the campus look very big, but it feels smaller than the observed geographical footprint.

The university's observed focal point of reference during the campus tour was the area in, and around the Memorial Walkway, which is the center of the campus. Student pedestrian sidewalks all converge at this point from several locations around the campus including the academic, and residence halls. When you look at the campus map you can easily observe the main focal point. My tour guide told us that students come to the grassy areas around the library, student, and recreational center to relax and talk about school and life.

The design and physical setting of the university is unique because the campus is located across the river from an old steel mill with several small clusters of private homes close to the river to the north, and a huge mountain to the south. The overall security geography is also unique because the university uses the mountain's physical landscaping, not metal fencing around the school's perimeter to give it a welcoming, and private community feel to it. This physical barrier provides access control to several vehicle, and pedestrian entrances on the bottom, and top of the mountain, which requires I.D. for access control in the day, and night as well. The internal map of the school observes several unique features within the site due to it's multiple campus design. The school is split into 3 parts, including a large sports facility situated off Mountain Drive South. The other traditional college facilities are located on the bottom of the hill except for the numerous Greek houses along upper, and lower Sayre Park Road, which is the main road to the top of the hill. The area is called "The Hill" for this reason.

The physical landscape of the college allows students to get away from classes to retreat to their residence halls, which are located on both ends of the school. These types of structures enhance the campus lifestyle within the schools sprawling footprint. The buildings geographical design features form a large oval in which students can enter, and leave the campus from several locations. Parking resources is also a big feature on campus due to the limited number of parking permits issued to students and employees. Parking is a big challenge for public safety at Lehigh because the college is located in a small city with a limited number of parking lots for students, employees, and visitors. Students at the university have access to several transportation resources on campus, which helps limit the need for student parking permits.

The university is also linked together by several city streets within it's massive real estate holdings with virtually all of the university's lecture halls, arts & science pavilions, residence halls, and historic buildings tied within it's large real estate holdings. The footprint is unique because students can retreat to their residence halls, or they can travel to other Lehigh facilities to experience big campus living. These types of educational, and social resources enhance the campus community lifestyle within each schools urban & suburban footprint because students can travel to several areas in a short period of time.

**Local weather:** Weather is also an issue to consider for students preparing for a college experience. The Lehigh Valley enjoys all four seasons of weather including rain and snow. Northeast weather patterns sometimes allow for temperatures to drop below 32 degrees for a considerable amount of time during the winter. Pennsylvania gets its share of snow during this period. Students also experience periods of rain during the spring and summer months as well. A strong indicator of pedestrian traffic around the university can be identified by the northeast weather patterns. Student parking within close proximity to university buildings and student shuttle services help reduce the exposure literally and figuratively.

## **Community Profile**

The City of Bethlehem has been described as a historic city due to its relationship to the steel industry. The city itself is nicknamed the Christmas, and Steel City for its name and location within the Lehigh Valley. The city itself has grown around its local steel mill, and university with students, and local residents enjoying the community's economical, and cultural landscape. The city has also been described, as a student friendly community because of the school's historical population was steel workers themselves. Lehigh also has an intellectual side due to its historical neighborhood architecture and close physical relationship to the above-mentioned work force. The local area is favorable to students and residents because it offers several pedestrian walkways on Morton Street, which links students, visitors, and local residents to a several restaurants and local shops within walking distance to the campus.

The community has a small city feel to it when you are walking to neighborhood parks and eateries on the southern edge of city. Residents and students also enjoy several social destinations on 4<sup>th</sup> Street including nightclubs, movie theatres, and food stores which are in walking distance to the campus. The walk from student housing on the hill to the northern of the campus is approximately 10 minutes. Students can also walk off the campus, or take the shuttle to shopping areas around the school.

The City of Bethlehem is located within the northeastern area of the state, which makes it convenient to several suburban, and city communities including Allentown and Reading within the Lehigh Valley Region. These communities have several major highway networks that offer residents efficient transportation resources to all areas of the state including Route 78, 476, and 22. The Lehigh Valley also links to Amtrak, which is the main connection to the northeast corridor for rail service. Lehigh also has several local roadways that connect the community to major state highways including Routes 222, and 33 that links to the Pocono Mountain Resort area, and Interstate 76. Shopping, restaurants, and hotel chains can be found within these major transportation networks after a short drive from the campus. Appendix #1 on the back page of this profile lists several of observed resources in close proximity to the school.

The following demographics for the City of Bethlehem describe a multi-cultural community within a total population of 72,704 according to the U.S. Census Bureau. Lehigh University has strong relationships with the city because they share community services including public safety, and cultural resources. An example of this commitment can be observed through the university's community services handbook that describes educational programs, health care programs and services, legal programs and services to local residents who may require community help.

A Census Bureau community survey highlights several characteristics to describe the population including: 52% of residents are male, 48% are female. 81.8% of residents are white, 3.6% are African American, 18.2% is Hispanic or Latino, and 2.2% are Asian. 21% of residents are 18 years old or over, and 17.9% of city residents is over the age of 65. The issue of housing in Lehigh is also interesting. 36% of housing units are renter-occupied, while 58% of units are owner-occupied.

## **Campus Life**

Lehigh University is a multi-cultural campus environment that provides students with an excellent social, and educational atmosphere. The admissions demographics paint a picture of a very diverse community with students from all over the world. The local suburban community of south Bethlehem only adds to the universities international status because the community has multi-cultural roots as well. Lehigh University addresses the issue of ecology in a positive way with the campus being situated within a historical area. The school has also developed green technologies and architecture for the campus including a new science center on Morton Street. All the buildings have some type of historical "Green Theme" because the school is first, and foremost an engineering school with several technological projects underway. Our student guide went as far as describing the old school laboratory which, had pockets of sand and multiple fireplaces to prevent fires during experiments conducted at the turn of the century.

The campus was clean and well maintained and the emotional climate of the entire community is positive because students are involved with local community, and campus groups through the student center and Greek life. An observation of this very positive emotional climate can be found by looking at the endless student flyers posted throughout the campus on walls, doors, windows, and light poles. These flyers describe upcoming activities and they invite all students to enjoy the clubs, performing arts, and public discussions on world events. Social networking beyond the campus walls is also a very important issue to be observed at Lehigh. Students at the university are encouraged to participate in externships with alumni to gain real world experience in each student's major. These programs, along with internships, and global learning centers offer valuable information for students studying abroad, which helps round out their individual educational activities on campus.

This issue of school culture and emotional attachment is also a very important part of campus life because everyone wants to have a connection and emotional fit to their new school and community. The college has done a great job developing positive social systems with its students by providing a series of coordinated programs including workshops and seminars for freshman students. This type of process provides a foundation for learning and personal growth providing over 150 academic, and 40 athletic clubs, and student organizations. Lehigh also has 24 NCAA Division I teams for men and women to participate in.

Campus life at Lehigh can be considered intellectual, and social due to several notable student venues including the Hawk's Nest inside Lamberton Hall, which is the main social center on campus. The school also has a second student center called Grace Hall that has a theatre, and a student radio station called (WLVR 91.3 FM). Students can also enjoy the state of the art recreational facility within Taylor Gym. Students can use this facility at any time because the school has a separate facility for its sports teams. The campus facilities allows students to enjoy more than academic excellence, it gives them the opportunity to develop social relationships by experiencing school sports, Greek life, performing arts, history, cultural events, restaurants, and local museums together.

**Student Housing:** The purpose of student housing is to provide safe and reasonable accommodations for students living away from home. The issue of housing and dormitory life is a critical element of overall campus life because students spend a large amount of time in their rooms. Student housing units historically come in 3 different styles including traditional corridor, suite, and apartment style units.

Lehigh University only guarantees on campus housing for freshman students, all other students participate in a lottery system for on campus housing. The school does provide housing for 69% of its total student population including the Greek Houses. Lehigh has a large Greek presence on campus with over 30% of students living in fraternities, and sororities. These Greek houses can be observed while driving up the hill to the Mountaintop campus. Information about housing can be found on the quick links page of this document.

**Off Campus Housing:** Lehigh has been described as a mid-sized private college within a residential community. The reason I have mentioned the overall community is to re-assert the point that school's network of facilities has encapsulated the real estate holdings in the area. The campus design allows a large number of students to have housing within walking distance to university facilities. The issue of off campus housing has a different feel to it compared to other university housing demands. The college itself has 69% of its student population living on campus which reduces the need, or demand for off campus housing. Students who want off campus housing can find information about available resources on the quick links page.

**Public Transportation:** Campus transportation resources for students are available through the college's shuttle system, which provides van service for daily classes, student activities, and links to local shopping and restaurants. This service is crucial to students who don't have cars because it provides transportation services to the entire community. The school's shuttle service provides reliable transportation to students who don't, or can't have vehicles on campus. The college also has a very large number of out of state students who don't know the streets and highways very well. Knowing the area is key because students who come from local states may know the area better and may be able to walk or drive to local destinations. Foreign, and out of state students might opt to take a bus or train to their destination because they don't want to risk getting lost on local roads.

**Description of Campus Public Safety Plans & Procedures:** Campus communities are unique places due to their populations and physical layouts. In some areas of the United States you really can't tell where a campus begins or ends because people walk through, drive through, and take campus transportation through all areas of the campus footprint. Lehigh has developed public safety plans and procedures to keep students, and employees safe. The school's general public safety plans and procedures can be found in the document " Emergency Preparedness Plan " which gives students and employees a list of instructions, procedures, codes of conduct, and response strategies to follow while on campus. This information can be found in Lehigh's Annual Public Safety Report.

#### **Crisis Management Plans & Procedures Local Community**

The State of Pennsylvania has developed emergency management resources to help residents to prepare, respond, and recover from a host of natural, and man made events. The state agency responsible for emergency operations is the Emergency Management Agency. Contact information for this state agency [www.readypa.org](http://www.readypa.org)

**Innovative Emergency Communications:** Lehigh University has developed reverse 911 systems that sends several types of emergency notifications through e-mail, hard line, and phone text message systems. Campus alerts, and weather related information is sent through this system. The university also has active shooter protocols for students to follow during an emergency including lock-down, and lockout procedures. These messages are usually received within 1-2 minutes of emergency broadcast and allow university officials to adhere to Clery Act requirements for timely warnings of emergency events.

**Campus Access Control & Security Systems:** The design, and physical setting of a particular institution has elements relating to the overall culture and social system on campus. Since college and university campuses are designed to offer (open) movement of people through it's borders, the issue of design, along with effective use of space can reduce both the incidence, and fear of crime. This design feature is called "Crime Prevention through Environmental Control." The proper design and effective use of the built environment can lead to a reduction in the fear and incidence of crime and an improvement in the quality of life. The issues of identifying formal gathering and high-

risk areas within a campus landscape are also critical to public safety because manpower must be observed in these areas.

The design and physical setting of Lehigh University is unique for a small city campus because the footprint has historical value due to its famous founder. The campus map highlights several historic buildings, which form a large barrier around the main campus. These buildings, along with natural landscaping form a large oval that's several city block long, and wide. These physical security design features seem to have enhanced the footprint by using natural, and manmade resources to limit access to the overall campus.

The college has several entrances and exits to maximize the pedestrian traffic flow within the facility, the issue of vehicle traffic on campus is minimal due to the city setting and a limited number of street parking spots. Lehigh's public safety department deploys officers to several access points around the campus during the day to reduce the number of people who may not have legitimate business on campus. Public safety also maintains visitor screening with clearly worded signage that directs visitors to a welcome area within Alumni Hall (Admissions), visitors who wish to walk around the campus without an escort can, but only during daylight hours.

Formal gathering areas within the campus are situated in, and around Memorial Walk, which is the main pedestrian walkway that connects the campus to several other gathering places including the library, student, and recreational centers. These areas around the walkway also have several residence, and academic halls that connect the pedestrian path to the Zoellner Arts Center on the northeastern edge of the campus. These areas are the main observed focal points of the campus. The design of the campus walk is a textbook example of CPTED because it allows for natural surveillance and open space for people to enjoy while still providing some type of student ownership.

The issue of high-risk areas on campus has been identified during annual risk assessments by security consultants, and feedback by all intuitional stakeholders including public safety officials. The department maintains uniform patrol, fixed security posts, and high tech remote resources to highlight formal surveillance throughout the campus. The department also has security officers patrolling on foot in several high-risk areas including the student center, sports venues, residence halls, and the library. Lehigh public safety officers also patrol the exterior of the college in several types of vehicles including 4-wheel drive trucks.

Lehigh University's public safety officers have attended a formal Police Academy training program to gain formal arrest powers. These officers have the training and ability to investigate criminal activity on campus. The school's public safety department has developed enhanced lighting, and formal surveillance resources (CCTV) for perimeter areas because it helps with surveillance and gives students and visitors an enhanced feeling of safety and security. Lehigh University has provided a safe environment on campus but students should be aware that the campus ends beyond university walk. Students should exercise personal awareness while walking on, and beyond 4<sup>th</sup> Street after dark. The same can be said for areas beyond Broadhead Avenue.

The campus high-risk areas including the residence halls require a higher degree of natural and formal surveillance for students and visitors. The university uses Smart Card Readers for access to on campus residence facilities. Students attempting to enter a residence must swipe their student card for entry into the building. Students attempting to enter a different residence hall with their card will be denied access because the card knows where you live. Lehigh students who attempt to keep the exterior doors open for their friends will be introduced to an added security alarm that activates after a door is open more than 30 seconds. Finally, students living in the Greek residential system have regular keys to their particular house.

### **Descriptions of Published Policies and Procedures to Comply with the Clery Act**

The Clery Act. The Crime Awareness and Campus Security Act of 1990 requires all postsecondary institutions participating in the Title IV student financial aid programs to disclose campus crime statistics, university violations and disciplinary data, and finally security information to the U.S. Department of Education on an annual basis. The legislation also describes several required policy statements that address public safety and security issues. Below is a sample list of Clery Act Policy Statements for colleges and universities to publish each year within their prospective crime report/audits.

**Required policy statements include:** addressing timely warnings, disclosure of crime statistics, reporting criminal offenses, confidential reporting, security and access control, arrest authority, security awareness programs, crime prevention programs, sex offenses, alcoholic beverages, illegal drugs, substance abuse programs, and general codes of conduct. Lehigh's Clery Act info can be found on the quick links page.

**Caveat:** Lehigh University's public safety officers have formal arrest powers; they have the ability to investigate criminal activity on campus, and the resources to reduce victimization off campus. Public Safety seems to have improved crime victimization on campus due to improved security resources but the following statement from the department education offers this advice. "The department data reported by the institutions have not been subjected to independent verification by the U.S. Department of Education. Therefore, the department cannot vouch for the accuracy of the data reported. Lehigh crime data can be found at: <http://ope.ed.gov/security/Index.aspx>

**Local Crime Statistics:** The Federal Bureau of Investigation's Uniform Crime Report for 2008 has developed crime statistics for the City of Bethlehem Pennsylvania. In 2008 the Police Department reported 225 Violent Crimes, 0 Murders, 12 Forcible Rapes, 107 Robberies, 106 Aggravated Assaults, 2,422 Property Crimes, 399 Burglaries, 1,885 Larceny Thefts, and finally 138 Motor Vehicle Thefts. The crime of Arson was reported 5 times in 2008.

**Emergency Medical Technicians:** Lehigh University has public safety officers who respond along with a volunteer University EMS crews. The City of Bethlehem Ambulance/ EMS provides hospital transport services to students, residents, and visitors through emergency notification systems. Below is the contact information for services, and general information for the local hospitals.
